The Stone Age (A period of time when humans used stone to make tools) covers a huge period of time over 3 million years. It can be broken down into 3 smaller time

periods

Palaeolithic- 3 million BC- Early

Humans used simple tools with sharp edges

Mesolithic- 10,000 BC- hunters-gatherers on the move to keep warm and stay safe

Neolithic - around 4500-2400 BC. Farming developed and villages were built



Famous landmarks in England -
Stone Henge- A very famous prehistoric monument in Wiltshire England.

Skara Brae- A stone age village in Orkney, Scotland
