Can you guess which book belongs to which teacher?

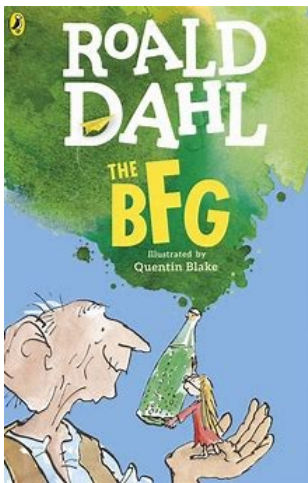
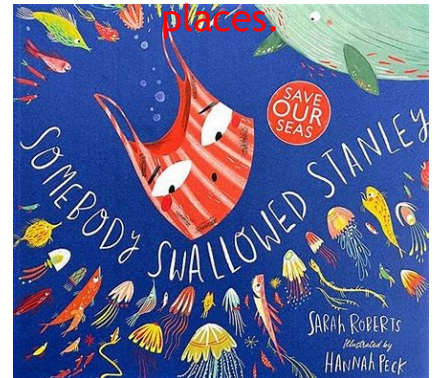

The book that made me cry was **Somebody Swallowed Stanley**.

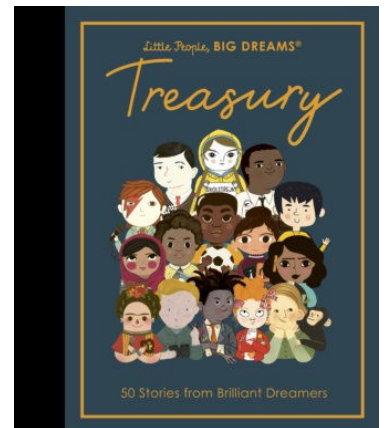

The book that made me fall in love with reading was **The BFG**.

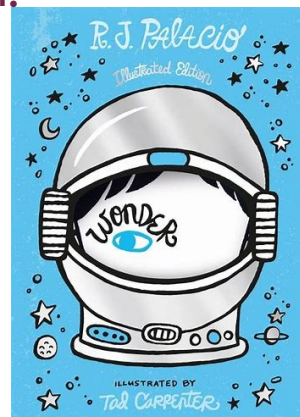
The book that made me feel inspired was **The Little People, Big Dreams Treasury**.
